From the desk of the Rabbi

Each & every year I ask myself the same question: how can I feel the loss, the sadness of our exile during the saddest period and day on the Jewish calendar, Tisha B'Av.

As we know, Tisha B'Av marks the destruction of both Temples in Jerusalem, as well as other catastrophes of Jewish history is around the corner. This coming Monday night, August 12, and the following day, August 13, will be set aside for rituals of communal mourning. We will sit low to the ground, keep our greetings to one another to a minimum, and make ample space to sit in our communal grief and pain.

Many of the events that Tisha B'Av commemorates occurred hundreds, even thousands, of years ago. If it is the very distant past, why the need to continue observing this day?

In part, it is because the tragedies of Tisha B'Av are not only historically significant, but are still relevant to us today. We still not only feel the impact they have had, but because of the lessons that we glean from them.

Quoting an article in which Leslie Klein, a contemporary Jewish historian, and the academic dean of the Women's Institute of Torah Seminary and College, based in Baltimore: "The Jewish people didn't have faith in GD and in Moshe that the land of Cana'an, (Israel) was a good place for them, and instead believed the negative information that came from the spies. They believed the 'fake news' they were told that night, and for that, were punished".

Tisha B'Av is not only an occasion to reflect on the tragedies that occurred on the 9th of Av, but during the totality of Jewish history. The prevelant custom is to use the date as an opportunity to mourn for victims of the many tragedies that have befallen us. The Spanish Inquisition, Pogroms, Libels, the Holocaust, October 7th and other devastating events.

As it is a communal day of mourning for all the tragedies that have happened to Jewish people throughout our history, we collectively mourn. Why? Because we are one nation, so your tragedies are my tragedies.

The Beit HaMikdash was our Creator's beloved home, and ours, too. There was a problem of sinat chinam, baseless hatred, and so during Tisha B'Av, our objective is to do the opposite, to spread love amongst our Jewish brothers and sisters and stand together in our mourning.

So how can we have a meaningful Tisha B'Av? Perhaps to think of it slightly differently than we may be used to.

While mourning remains the primary goal of Tisha B'Av, the fact that we have experienced so many hardships, yet still persist as a nation, is inspiring. We are the same nation that experienced GD's incredible might with the Exodus, received the Torah, many miracles, and have passed our Holy Torah and status as a Holy Nation. WE are a testament to the resilience of the Jewish people, and that we will not forget who we are, and that no matter what has happened to us, we believe we are here to work toward a better future with GD in this world.

Yes, of course it is important to remember what we've lost, physically and spiritually. In fact, it's essential. We experienced loss, and even 2,000 years later, are still experiencing that same loss. Our commemorating Tisha B'Av shows that we yearn for redemption, yearn for a world that is truly Godly, at peace, free from strife and confusion. There's an importance in remembering where we come from and what's important to us as a nation. It is easy to lose sight of that, but ultimately, we are affirming our unity, that we care about each other, even while recognizing what we've lost. We are a nation that does not passively "not forget", but rather we are a nation that actively remembers.

We at SHC are here for YOU, as you are here for US. We are ONE. May this month of Av be transformed into a month of joy, life and peace.



INTERNATIONAL SPAIN DILLER SEMINAR | 7 July
Spain

Attended by Alexand Franco, who reflects on his experience:

"On the 7th of July a group of 20 Jewish Teens from Cape Town embarked on the one week International Spain Diller Seminar. Among this group were 3 teens from our community, myself, Benjamin and Samuel Marks. After almost a year of evolving and learning as Jewish Leaders in Cape Town we were eager to meet the other groups that were taking apart from around the world. Cohorts from Canada, Australia, America and Israel spent this week with us as we bonded and made new connections with fellow Jewish teens that had had similar experiences to us throughout the Diller program.

The week involved touring the towns of Cordoba and Granada, learning about the history of the Jewish people in Spain, listening to first-hand experiences of October 7th, many discussions and talks on Judaism in the 21st Century and of course making new friends. During our tour of the Jewish quarter in Cordoba we visited a museum solely dedicated to the history of Sephardic Jews. After a short presentation from the tour guide, myself, Samuel and Benjamin wandered around constantly finding things that were familiar to us, personally it was very interesting reading about the history of our community.

Taking part in the Diller program is one of the best decisions I have ever made. I have gained a great deal of knowledge on how to be a good leader in and out of the Jewish community and grown in understanding of my Jewish identity"








